Türkiye became a Contracting Party to the Convention in 1984

One of the main users of the System + an important transit country

TIR remains the only international transit procedure with a large number of countries

Declining usage over the recent years = need for modernization

18 Regional Directorates


148 Customs Offices authorized to handle TIR procedures

47 of the Customs
Offices are also
authorized to issue
Certificates of Approval

21 BCPs are authorized to Process TIR Carnets



Aspects of the TIR System Handled by National Legislation





National Digital Platforms for the TIR

TIRCUS

- National TIR Pre-Declaration Platform
- Pre-Declaration is mandatory = computer based risk analysis
- Being updated to handle eTIR procedures

TIR TRACKING PROGRAM

- Customs Platform to process paper-based TIR operations digitally
- Used by Customs
 Officers for
 registration and
 controls

ETOBS

- Certificate of Approval System
- Used for issuing and recording CoAs and related procedures
- Allows the verification of CoA Electronically
- Integrated with the TIR Tracking Program

VEHICLE TRACKING SYSTEM

- Used for all road transports, including TIR
- Application is based on risk analysis
- Vehicles are tracked real-time



Good Practices

• Import/Export Procedures are Conducted at Inland Customs Offices

• Trade Facilitation (AEO/Authorized Consignor + Consignee)

Complete and Up-to-Date Record Keeping (ITDB)
